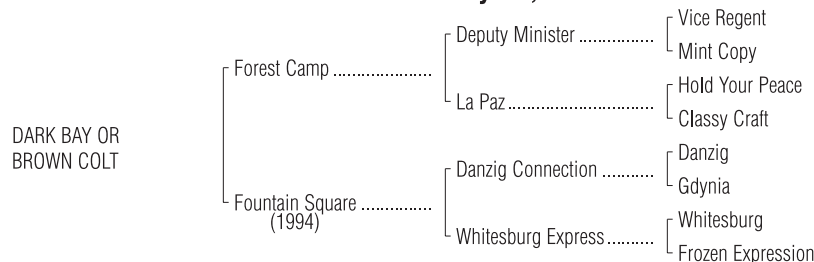

Forest Camp/Fountain Square 2004 dark bay or brown colt

Conformation Notes:

Big, tall, rangy, muscular, lengthy colt; masculine head and eye with a kind, honest outlook; lovely neck with a long, sloping shoulder; powerful chest with a deep rib and girth; smooth topline with a well developed, muscular hip and quarter; tremendous bone and substance; very slightly back at the knee, a little soft in the pasterns, turns in very slightly both front; excellent mover; two turn horse; like very much; racehorse. 8

This is a well-grown, rangy, scopey colt with great size and substance by the very promising freshman sire Forest Camp. Forest Camp has made an outstanding start to his stallion career, having already sired nine individual two-year-old winners thus far from his first crop. What is so remarkable is that each of these nine winners won their first career lifetime start, a feat that has not been accomplished by a freshman sire in recent memory. His first crop winners include the talented colt The Pharaoh, who was a promising second to Stevie Wonderboy after a troubled trip in the Del Mar Futurity G2. Among his other winners is the filly Sleeping (out of White Cliffs), who was in our 2004-2005 partnership. Sleeping won her first start very impressively in a maiden special at Belmont Park and followed that up with another impressive allowance win at Monmouth. Forest Camp quickly established himself as a sire on the racetrack, and consequently his yearlings have sold very well this year – his sale topper was the Forest Camp / Taegu colt who sold for \$1,000,000 to Robert and Beverly Lewis at the September Sales. His yearling average of \$147,400 for 15 sold is a great return on a \$10,000 stud fee. This colt is out of the multiple stakes placed mare Fountain Square, who was a good, solid runner on the Kentucky racing circuit, winning five races with career earnings of \$202,989. This colt has more size, length and substance than most of the Forest Camps and he looks like he would be able to breeze a strong quarter mile at the two-year-old sales. He is a powerful, mature, rangy colt and should be able to carry his speed around two turns. He will be pointed to the Fasig-Tipton Calder Sale.
